



Life Group Discussion Questions

*** This guide intentionally has more questions than your group could reasonably discuss in one meeting. Feel free to pick and choose questions that best encourage, challenge, and instruct your particular participants.

1. Rob taught us that life has a purpose. What is your purpose in life? Generally, and specifically? What has God called you to do? What is your spiritual gift and how are you using that to edify the body of Christ?
2. Jeremiah was given the task of speaking truth for many years. The words he spoke were not popular. Do you find it difficult to speak truth when it is not popular? What would change in our culture if we spoke truth instead of shying away from potential conflict?
3. We are designed to glorify God. I Cor. 10:31 says, "So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.". How can we best glorify God in our "routine" daily task? Can you think of a specific example of a time that you used the ordinary to do the extraordinary in glorifying God?
4. God is always in control. When you feel out of control of something, does that bother you? Are you really in control of anything?
5. Read Ephesians 1:3-10. To what things specifically has God predestined us for? What does it mean to "be holy and blameless"? See how often uses words like "purpose", "will" and "plan". How can we best live out this plan in our lives to bring Him the most glory?

6. God has purpose for life. For all life. Every single person is made in the image of God, and is made for a purpose. Our purpose is to glorify God in all sorts of ways. How do you respond to that knowledge?

7. Paul says in Philippians 2:14-16; “Do all things without grumbling or disputing, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life...” Rob also mentioned Matthew 5:13-16. How can we best show our light to a lost and dying world? Are there things we should cease doing that diminish or hide that light? What about when you have to go to Walmart? Or when you are in traffic? Or you work with someone who embodies darkness and irritates you?

8. How do we keep from falling prey to self-serving Christianity? How do we stay focused on giving God glory, and not feeling like the center of importance?

9. The Westminster Confession of Faith says; “the chief end of man is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever.” What is the correlation between glorifying God and enjoying Him? Are the separate tasks or are they connected? How do we learn to enjoy Him? What role does doing good works play in bringing glory to God? (See Titus which mentions this at least 6 times.)
