



## Life Group Discussion Questions

Read Luke 19:28-40

1. Christ entered Jerusalem as a humble king, and His life was one of humility.(See Philippians 2)

How can we learn and exercise humility to show Christ's love to others as we emulate our savior?

2. Psalm 118:6 says "The lord is for me, I will not fear." Christ entered Jerusalem facing a certain death. How do we face the fears and trials we encounter daily? Share a time you found refuge in God.

3. Luke 19:41 says Jesus wept. Do we weep for the lost? Share some names of those you know who are lost and pray as a group for your family, friends, coworkers, and friends who you love and are lost.

4. Do you believe God's word is true? All of it? Are there things you doubt or question? Why should we trust ALL God has revealed to us through His son and His word? How does the truth provide us hope, strength, and peace?

5. God's purpose from day 1 was to bring salvation. How do you share that with others? How do we model and display that? Or should we display that to a lost and dying world? Do you need help in knowing how to share your faith? How can we help one another most effectively?
6. Jesus is king! How do we faithfully show our service and reverence for our king in very practical ways? Can others tell by our lives that Christ is our king? How do we model this for our children and family?
7. Take some time as a group to praise God and thank Him for his steadfast love.
8. Luke 19:28-34 has very specific instructions from Jesus detailing what to do, and what will happen, and even what to say. Do you envy that level of specificity from the Lord? Do you wish God would just tell you what to say, when to say it, and what will happen when you do? Why is life not that way? What does that show about God, people, and our relationship with Him?
9. The Jews around Jesus were hungry for a king. Why did they want a king? Did Jesus meet their expectations? What was good about the Jews longing for a king? What was bad? What promises were they holding onto?
10. Are you, like the Jews, waiting for a king to show up and solve your problems? Are you looking at the eternal and spiritual ramifications of being in God's kingdom, or like the Jews, are you focused on the temporary plights of the flesh? Does Jesus care about both?
