



## Life Group Discussion Questions

Read Job 1:1-5

1. Chuck Colson defined Integrity as “being the same person off stage you are on stage”. What do you think he meant by that? Would you define Integrity differently?
2. Think of someone you know who exhibits true Integrity. How do they demonstrate that important attribute? Consider the following statement: “Integrity is the one attribute that no one can take from you, it has to be willingly given away.” Do you believe that is true? If so, why or why not? Why is integrity such an important trait when applied to our Christian life and witness?
3. What does it mean to fear God? How do we come to have that holy fear? Is it a natural response of man or is it a learned trait? How do we develop it to its fullest extent within our earthly limitations?
4. Job was a moral man. How are morals decided in our culture? Should culture define our morals? How should our morals be determined and do we teach and model them for our children? Where did Job find his moral code (keep in mind he did not have the written Word).

5. Job was a wealthy man yet he had compassion on the poor, the widows and the outcasts. How can we best use the blessings and resources we have to show Christ to those we encounter?

6. Job is described as a man that was blameless, upright, feared God, and turned away from evil. Is this a recipe of a person that is attainable? In other words, can we be like Job?

7. Consider how someone peering into your life would describe you. For instance, if the NSA, Facebook, or Google decided to codify you as a Christian, or not, based on your digital activities... would they define you as Christian?

8. Would other people describe you as God fearing? Is that the secret to success in your life?

9. Was anyone else in scripture described the same way that God described Job?

10. It sounds like Job was very wealthy, and very faithful. Is that hard to do? How did Job do it?

11. What was Job's concern for his children? What do you sacrifice for your kids?

12. How does Job foreshadow and point to Christ?
