Read Job 1:13-22

1. How do you deal with grief. Can you share a time when you were comforted in grief and how you were comforted?
2. Isaiah 53:3 says that Christ was “acquainted with grief”. How does knowing our Savior endured grief help us in coming to terms with our own grief?
3. We are promised trials. How do the following passages help us understand our proper biblical response to trials: I Peter 1:6-9, I Peter 4:12-13 and James 1:2-3?
4. Can you share a time when you had a specific trial and saw God working to develop strength and endurance/perseverance in your life that would encourage others?
5. Doctrine/Theology is often avoided as a lofty enterprise. Other than attending church and Life Group, how do you personally develop your understanding of doctrine. Can you recommend some resources that would be helpful to others in the group? What other means can we use to develop a true knowledge of proper doctrine?

6. There is a direct correlation between worship and right doctrine. Godliness is defined as “worshiping rightly” or “the reverent awareness of God’s sovereignty over every aspect of life”. How does proper doctrine exalt and enrich our worship. Is there something specific you have learned about doctrine that has made your worship for reverent and meaningful.
7. Is your relationship with God transactional? Do you expect a return on your “religious investment”?
8. Is your first reaction to tragedy to praise God? Is your first reaction to anything to praise God?
9. Why did Job tear his robe and shave his head?
10. Do you minimize the grief of other people? How about your own grief?
11. Do you love those who grieve? How? What does that look like?
12. Job said “The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away”. Does your theology match that statement? Is that a difficult truth for you?
