Read Job 11-14

1. There are a lot of sources of counsel in our world. What counsel should we listen to? How can we accurately discern between good and bad counsel?
2. Have you ever heard someone say; "I have word from the Lord" or "God told me...." How should we respond to these statements? Should we respond at all? What is a proper view of revelation? Can you think of scriptures that apply to this question?
3. Sadly, too many Christians get their theology and doctrine from social media, T.V., radio, and popular best sellers at the "Christian" bookstore. How can some of these sources be dangerous and harmful to our Christian development? How can we best filter out truth from false teaching? (See 1st Timothy 4:1-3 and Matthew 15:8-9).
4. Milk is good to drink, but adding just a couple drops of poison to a cold glass of milk can turn nutrition into a deadly cocktail. Why must we be alert for those who mix truth with error? Can you think of some examples of those who mix truth with their own twist or personal agenda that we should be aware of? Why is discernment so vital to Christian growth? How do we develop that discernment?

5. Have you ever had a friend or friends like those Job had? You know, someone who seemed like a friend but was prone to make you question your beliefs or who had very strong but unbiblical opinions on everything? How did that person make you feel? Were you able to maintain that friendship? How can we guard ourselves from being that kind of "friend"?
6. Do you defend the truth of scripture when your friends tell you that it's wrong?
7. Do you let the worldview of those around you redefine Biblical doctrine?
8. Job argues for God's sovereignty despite his frustration with his current circumstances. What must you do to have that level of faith and surety?
9. Consider Job's response to his friends when he would rather face God and accept the consequences than deal with his friends anymore. What does that say about Job's character and convictions?
10. What was the biggest takeaway for you from this sermon? Is it because of what is happening in your life right now?
